Marine services and innovation support major wind farms


JFMS is bringing its world-renowned marine services skills and innovation to the growing offshore wind energy sector in East Anglia.

The company has invested heavily in the East of England in recent years, including the development of its renewables support base in Lowestoft.

It is delivering a £3m contract to supply integrated marine services to ScottishPower Renewables' £2.5bn East Anglia ONE wind farm whose construction is due to be finished by 2020.

JFMS will provide marine coordination through its innovative Offshore Wind Management System (OWMS)[®] which provides real-time data to ensure safe, efficient and economic management of offshore wind farms.

Other services include guard vessels, boundary markers, an offshore communications

system and campaigns to identify and remove unexploded ordnance.

JFMS also supported the earlier Galloper wind farm and has a successful track record, delivering hundreds of projects across over 50 renewable project sites. It has developed a number of offshore wind specific advancements including state-of-the-art software solutions.

As well as the award-winning OWMS[®] it has also developed:

- Mermaid - marine operations planning and risk management software
- Ship-to-Turbine - turbine gearbox oil exchanges reducing downtime by around half
- Wind turbine blade - blade curing that is 25-times faster than conventional methods

JFMS now has around 150 employees and in 2018 reported a turnover of £85m.

The company is an active member of EEEZ partner the East of England Energy Group, where strategy and business development director Martin Dronfield is chairman of the Offshore Wind Special Interest Group.

The company works with EEEZ partners to help promote the region and views its relationship with the partners as being "almost symbiotic." It also views the formation of an All Energy Industry Council by the New Anglia Local Enterprise Partnership as an important development for the region.
